Safer Neighbourhood policing – “What does it mean and what do they do?” Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT’s) were introduced in every ward in London in April 2006. The idea is “Local officers, policing a local area and dealing with its’ residents and the problems that directly concern them”

Every SNT is made up of 1 Sergeant, 2 Police Constables and 3 Community Support Officers. There are alternative ways of reporting low-level crime to the police that may avoid you having to queue at a police station. As of April the 1st the staff within your Safer Neighbourhoods Team have changed.

Sgt Chandler and his team of officers have policed the Fullwell ward for the past Three years during which time have they reduced reported crime and in conjunction with others have made significant improvements to the local area.

MARCH CRIME FIGURES

BURGLARY

There were a total of 17 Burglaries reported within Fullwell Ward.

There were 13 residential burglaries and 1 non-residential burglary.

There were a further 3 attempted burglaries to residential properties.

THEFT FROM / OF MOTOR VEHICLE

There were 10 thefts from motor vehicles and a total of 6 theft of motor vehicles reported from within Fullwell Ward.

There were also 5 people dealt with for possession of Cannabis and a further 4 for the offence of shoplifting



CURRENT CRIME TRENDS

Unfortunately the current “in vogue” crime at present is Burglary and Theft from Motor Vehicle.

Police are continuing to conduct targeted operations against those that commit these offences in an attempt to arrest those responsible and reduce the number of offences occurring, however we need your help.

Please lock your windows and double lock doors.

Please lock your vehicles and remove visible property from display.

On Thursday the 9th of April between 11am and 1pm officers from Fullwell Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team will be present within Sainsbury's, (Car Park), Tanners Lane, Barkingside.
